

FREE Social Engineering After-School Training Program for High School Students



Cyber hygiene is a key digital literacy skill that encompasses practices and steps that individual users and organizations take to maintain their online security and strengthen the security of their computers or other digital devices. Cybercriminals are increasingly leveraging poor cyber hygiene in their attacks; one strategy they use is social engineering (SE) to develop trust relationships with potential targets and then deceive them into revealing sensitive information (passwords), obtain unauthorized access (to restricted areas, servers, etc.), or commit fraud (via phishing or vishing).
