Special Academic Regulations for Students in Undergraduate Psychology Program

- ▶ IPFW courses PSY 369 and PSY 235 cannot be taken for credit toward graduation due to overlapping content with the Ivy Tech course PSYC 201.
- ▶ In the case of courses which can be repeated for credit (e.g., PSY 392; PSY 496), more than one section of the same course number must have substantially different content, as approved by the department chair, if both are to be used toward meeting this requirement.
- ▶ Successful completion of the major field test in psychology during the senior year.
