### **Special Academic Regulations for Students in the BGS Program**

Students must complete at least 20 of these credits after admission to the program. No more than 21 credits in a single arts and sciences department/subject area or 30 credits in a single professional school area may be counted. A minimum of 30 credits must be taken at the 300-400 level. At least 30 credits must be taken within the IU system or as a Purdue student at IPFW. A second writing course and a diversity course are required for the bachelor degree. No more than 30 hours of CLEP credits will be counted toward the bachelor degree. No more than 64 credit hours can be transferred from a community college.
