## *Central Indiana*

### **The Central Indiana Region**

Ivy Tech Community College's Central Indiana region is located in Indianapolis and serves eight counties: Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, Marion, Shelby and portions of Johnson and Morgan. It has two full service campuses, located in Indianapolis and Lawrence. It also offers classes in Avon, Beech Grove, Carmel, Greenwood, Greenfield, Lebanon, Mooresville, Noblesville and Shelbyville. It is the largest region in the Ivy Tech system, with more than 26,000 students enrolled in nine schools and 38 degree programs.

### **A Growing Campus**

The college's Indianapolis campus includes the 198,000 square foot Glenn W. Sample North Meridian Center, the 98,000 square foot Glick Family Technology Center and the 229,000 square foot Julia M. Carson Learning Resource Center. Established in 2003, the 265,000 square foot Fairbanks Center for Health Professions houses the region's business, health and public safety programs.

The Indianapolis campus is currently preserving the facade of the former St. Vincent Hospital site. The construction will add 204,000 square feet to the college's downtown Indianapolis campus. The new building will house the School of Liberal Arts & Sciences, along with a cafeteria, additional computer labs and community space. In the winter of 2010, the College acquired the former Stouffer's Hotel building, located one block north of the Indianapolis campus. Renovations have begun and the building is expected to be open in 2013.

### **The College**

Ivy Tech Community College is the nation's largest state-wide community college with single accreditation. It is the state's largest public post-secondary institution serving more than 150,000 students a year.

While our students enjoy the benefits of a large institution, with 23 campuses throughout the state, students find personal attention close to home at Ivy Tech.

Ivy Tech is the state's most affordable college. Students can earn a degree for about \$6,000. Using credits that transfer, students can save money by completing the first two years of a four-year degree at Ivy Tech. Ivy Tech's Workforce and Economic Development division offers local and affordable solutions for Indiana business and industry training needs.

Statewide, Ivy Tech is governed by a 14-member Board of Trustees appointed by the governor. Under terms of legislation, the members represent various economic interests: manufacturing, commerce, labor, agriculture, education and the public at large. This Board appoints the president of the statewide college. In addition, Ivy Tech-Central Indiana, like the other regional campuses, has its own seven-member board of trustees, whose members also represent varied interests. The state board appoints these members with the purpose of keeping the Central Indiana region in touch with local needs. The Central Indiana region is administered by a chancellor.

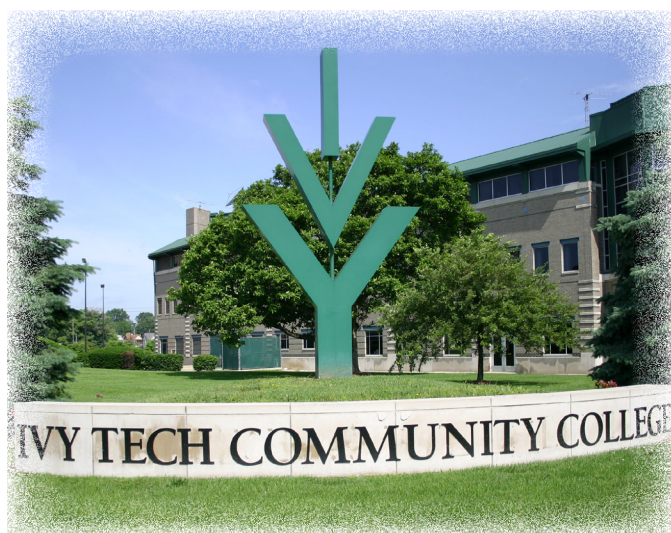
