HEALTH & WELLNESS RESOURCE CENTER

Health & Wellness covers all areas of medicine, health, and fitness. Access it by logging in to Campus Connect, then clicking on the Library tab. There are two points of access: 1) clicking on the top left box (**Virtual Library – Start**) or 2) using either of the top two links in the **Library Resources** box in the top middle. Either way, the link to Health & Wellness is located in the *Articles* areas of both links – Select Resource Collections and Select Resources by Subject.

SEARCHING

1. Type desired keyword or phrase in the **Search For:** box.
2. Two or more keywords or phrases need to be connected by either **AND, OR, or NOT**.
 - a. **AND** - articles contain **all** of the keywords or phrases.
 - b. **OR** - articles contain **any one** of the keywords or phrases.
 - c. **NOT** - **eliminates** articles containing certain keywords or phrases
3. Truncating (*) words, i.e. searching by the root of a word, gets more results
 - a. *kids and cancer* = limited hits, *kid* and cancer* = many more hits.

QUICK START – Choose a heading & follow instructions.

1. Medical Encyclopedia: alphabetical list of topics. **Good place to select a topic!**
2. Health Organization Directory: pay attention to the Limits box.
3. Health News: lists newspaper articles from around the world, newest first. Can use Search button.
4. Drug & Herb Finder: find information on specific drugs and medicinal herbs.
5. Medical Dictionary: note the choices under the Search box.
6. Alternative Health Encyclopedia: alphabetical topic list.
7. Health Assessment Tools: Cancerfacts.com, FreeWeightLoss.com, Healthanswers.com
8. Links to Other Sites: Centers for Disease Control, National Institutes of Health, & others.

RESULT LIST SCREEN

1. Results are grouped by types of documents; articles are listed in newest first order.
2. Full-text articles are indicated by the page symbol on the right side of each title.
3. A list of related subject links is located on the left. Clicking on your search term at top of the list will show broader and narrower terms as well as related terms.

Definition

Fetal alcohol syndrome (FAS) is a pattern of birth defects, learning, and behavioral problems affecting individuals whose mothers consumed alcohol during pregnancy.

Description

FAS is the most common preventable cause of mental retardation. This condition was first recognized and reported in the medical
