## NetLibrary: Books Online

**NetLibrary** contains a very comprehensive collection of e-books, i.e., electronic versions of books that are already in print. All topics are covered – from classics like *Beowulf* and Charles Dickens to the latest in construction, business, human resources, law, computers, social issues, etc. All titles are also listed in our catalog, Ivy Cat.

Accessing **NetLibrary**: login to Campus Connect, click on the Library tab, and then either click on the box at the top left (**Virtual Library – Start**) or use either of the top two links in the **Library Resources** box. The link to NetLibrary is located in the *Books* area of Select Resource Collections and Select Resources by Subject.

### BASIC SEARCH

1. Type keywords or phrases in search box.
  - a. Use keywords only, not words like *a, is, those, but, if, them*, etc.
  - b. Quotation marks (“ ”) must be used with phrases; ex.: “stem cells”.

NetLibrary provides access to your library's eContent collection. eContent is the digital version of books, journals, and database content. You can access your library's eContent 24 hours a days, seven days a week. [Learn More...](#)

2. Two or more search terms need to be connected by either **AND**, **OR**, or **NOT** (must be capitalized)
  - a. **AND** locates titles that contain all of the keywords or phrases.  
---ex.: European **and** history (results contain both words)
  - b. **OR** locates titles containing any one of the keywords or phrases.  
---ex.: heart **or** cardiac (results contain either word)
  - c. **NOT** eliminates titles containing certain keywords or phrases.  
---ex.: nursing **not** home (results contain nursing but not home)
3. Truncation: use an **asterisk** (\*) to retrieve all the various endings of a word.
  - a. Ex.: **abus\*** will also search for **abuse, abuser, abused, abusing, abuses, abusive**, etc.



**RESULT LIST:** Titles are automatically listed by relevance. Choose another sort method if desired.
