

Human Services Program—Technical Outcomes Assessment

The Human Services Program has implemented technical outcome measures as a way to determine whether the students have achieved the objectives of the Human Services Program. Beginning in fall of 2012, the Human Services program began utilizing an objective test, the HS-BCP (Human Services Board Certified Practitioner) exam, administered by the Center for Credentialing and Education, to measure successful student achievement. The HS-BCP exam will now be administered in HUMS 279: Human Services Capstone Course. This test will provide a more accurate and standardized assessment of student achievement in four categories: Theory, Ethics, Case Management, and Administration.

Results of the HS-BCP exam outcomes assessment for the Human Services Program are presented below in percentages of those with a proficient score by Ivy Tech Community College testing site:
