- Complete pre-req/co-req classes — See below: right hand column
- HLHS 102 & HLHS 101 can be either pre or co-req. APHY 101 & 102, (if taken earlier) are pre-reqs only. To have the best chance of success, the first 4-classes should be completed before enrollment into PHLB 212.
- HLHS 102, 121, & 101 can be taken in the 1st semester. HLHS 105, PHLB 212, & 257 can be taken in the 2nd semester.

Step 3: Class Information

- Most of the classes can be taken in a face-to-face or online format. Some of the HLHS classes are also offered as an 8-week or 16-week course, choose what works best for your schedule. The PHLB classes, 212 & 257 are both 8-week classes.
- Course Expectations
 - *Guidelines for the Externship – Please read this page carefully, there are cost associated to the course that are above and beyond the cost of tuition and books.*
 - *Students will need to have a current physical, proof of immunizations, show current TB results, and will need to complete a national background check and pass a drug screen before attendance at a clinical site. Also students will need to purchase a set of scrubs, and leather shoes for the class. The same scrubs and leather schools are good for the clinical site.*
 - *Forms for these items will be given on the first day of class.*
