First, you'll need your student ID number, also known as a C-Number: %%CNumber__c%% Hang onto this, as you'll need your C-Number to set up your Mylvy account.

Next, you'll need to set up your Mylvy account. Mylvy is where all of your student data is stored. It's a great starting point when trying to find information like scheduling an appointment with your advisor, submitting a HelpDesk ticket, accessing your student email account, and more! You can start by visiting <u>myivy.ivytech.edu</u> and clicking on the *First Time Here?* button. You'll need your Ivy Tech email address and C-Number to begin the login process.

The FAFSA is used by most colleges, including Ivy Tech, to determine eligibility for many types of financial assistance including grants, loans, federal work study programs, and more. Some types of funding are awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis, so it is important to file your FAFSA as soon as you are able.

Subject: Assess for success

We want to make sure the classes you take are the right fit for you. In order to accomplish this, we need to determine your reading, writing, and math skills through the <u>assessment process</u>. During the Ivy Tech assessment process, we can measure where your skills are currently at in several different ways, including ACT, SAT, or PSAT scores; high school GPA; previous college credit you've earned; or through the use of an assessment tool.

If you didn't have your test scores available to upload when you applied, that's OK! You have until the end of the term for which you applied to return to your application and upload your assessment documents.

Subject: Learn your way

There's no reason to be nervous about your first term at Ivy Tech Community College. We're here to help you every step of the way! Reach out to your local <u>enrollment center</u> if you have any questions.

As you prepare for registration, you'll want to consider how you want to take classes. Whether you're taking courses online, virtually, or in-person, you'll be able to get to know your peers. Our average class size is about 10 students. So, your instructors have the time and resources to help students on an individual basis.

Familiarize yourself with the course format you'll be able to choose from. Here is a list of each type:

- **Traditional** classes are exactly what you might expect. In this format the instructor and students gather in an on-campus classroom at a scheduled time.
- Online classes are where there is no scheduled class meeting time but students do have plenty of opportunities to interact with their instructor through lvyLearn. Course assignments will be assigned and completed through your lvyLearn class page on a weekly (or regular) basis.
- **Virtual** classes are similar to traditional classes but instead of meeting in the classroom you meet in a live video call at a scheduled time.
- **Blended** classes mix the traditional course format with virtual or online formats. There is a scheduled class time, but you'll spend some days in the classroom and some days in an online learning space.
- Learn Anywhere courses are taught in the classroom at a scheduled time but can also be accessed in a virtual format. Attendance at each class session is mandatory but students have the choice of whether they would like to attend in person or virtually on a week-to-week basis.
